Enjoy marshmallows and crafts around the fire and watch out for the weird and wonderful fairies on stilts. Come and be enchanted by the magical tales in the storytelling tent, or ascend to the woodland's highest peak to consult the towering oracle known only as Dream.

The afternoon is organised by The Mersey Forest in partnership with Forestry Commission and St.Helens Council as part of Access to Nature, a national scheme run by Natural England and funded by the Big Lottery Fund. The Mersey Forest's Jo Sayers said: "We're encouraging children to come along dressed up as elves or fairies, or they can make their own costume at the event itself throughout the afternoon. We're also providing free face painting to help complete their magical transformation!"

Bold Forest Park

Bold Forest Park is an evolving idea to develop the woodlands and businesses of south St.Helens as a place to visit and enjoy, bringing local jobs and prosperity. The Forest Park area straddles the M62 between Junctions 7 and 8. At its heart are areas of community woodland planted at the former colliery sites of Colliers Moss, Clock Face and Sutton Manor. The proposed park boundary also takes in woodland at Wheatacre, Maypole and Griffin Wood and a wider area of urban fringe farmland.
